

## REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

### Determination Number 6 of 1998

#### REMUNERATION AND ALLOWANCES FOR HOLDERS OF PUBLIC OFFICES


Pursuant to sub-sections 8(2) and 8(3) of the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*, the Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into the remuneration to be paid to Dr Paul Twomey, the holder of the public office of Chief Executive Officer for the National Office of the Information Economy, and other matters significantly related thereto, and determines as set out hereunder, with effect from 4 February 1998:

1. Salary at the rate of \$142,130 per annum.
2. An additional loading of \$20,000 above the salary specified in clause 1 above.
3. A level of performance based remuneration of up to 15% of the salary specified in clause 1 above payable annually.
4. The level of performance based remuneration payable shall be an amount determined by the Remuneration Tribunal having regard to an assessment by the Board of the National Office for the Information Economy from time to time.
5. If, on or after 4 February 1998, Dr Twomey elects to forego all preferential rights under the *Public Service Act 1922* or any other employing Act of the Commonwealth to take up, or return to, full time employment with the Commonwealth in another capacity at the conclusion of the appointment, he is entitled to be paid a loading of 20% of the rate of salary specified in clause 1 above per annum.
6. Travelling allowance shall be payable at the rates and under the same conditions of payment as determined from time to time for Secretaries of Departments.
7. Recreation leave entitlements shall be in accordance with the provisions of Determination No 33 of 1994.


8. If Dr Twomey is retired from the office for reasons other than physical or mental incapacity or unsatisfactory service before the expiration of the term of appointment, the compensation for loss of office will be in accordance with Determination No 11 of 1992.
