



REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

Explanatory Statement: Determination 2000/01

1. The Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into and determined the remuneration and significantly related matters for public office holders, as it is empowered to do by the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*.

Part 1 – Remuneration and Allowances – Judicial and Related Offices

2. Clause 1.1 specifies the Principal Determination, (Number 13 of 1999) for the purposes of Part 1 of the Determination.
3. Clause 1.2 clarifies the rules governing payment of daily fees for part-time office holders covered by the Principal Determination.
4. Clause 1.3 clarifies the method of calculating separation benefits for part-time office holders.
5. Clause 1.4 confirms the entitlements of Federal Magistrates and specifies annual leave entitlements for these office holders.

Part 2 – Full-time Holders of Public Office

6. Clause 2.1 specifies the Principal Determination, (Number 5 of 1999, as amended) for the purposes of Part 2 of the Determination.
7. Clauses 2.2 and 2.3 amends the Principal Determination in relation to the following offices:
 - (a) Commissioner of the Australian Federal Police following a review of remuneration;
 - (b) Director of the Australian National Maritime Museum following a review of remuneration;
 - (c) Director, Professional Services Review following a review of remuneration; and performance pay; and
 - (d) Director of Safeguards following a review of remuneration.

Part 3 – Part-time Holders of Public Office

8. Clause 3.1 specifies the Principal Determination, (Number 3 of 1999, as amended) for the purposes of Part 3 of the Determination.
9. Clause 3.2 addresses the renaming of an Advisory Council within the Agriculture Fisheries and Forestry Portfolio.
10. Clause 3.3 inserts two new offices and accompanying footnotes into Table 2 of the Principal Determination. No rate is specified for the Chair of the GST Start-up Advisory Assistance Panels as this office has not been referred to the Tribunal for determination.

11. Clause 3.4 deletes reference to a number of now defunct bodies within the Agriculture Fisheries and Forestry Portfolio.

Part 4 – Principal Executive Offices

10. Clause 4.1 specifies the Principal Determination, (Number 15 of 1999) for the purposes of Part 4 of the Determination.
11. Clause 4.2 makes a minor administrative re-description.
