



REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

Determination 2000/14: Remuneration and allowances for various public offices and Members of Parliament

- (i) The Remuneration Tribunal is empowered to inquire into and determine the remuneration and significantly related matters for holders of public office as defined in the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*.
- (ii) This Determination, No 14 of 2000 takes effect on and from the date of signature except where specified otherwise.

PART 1

FULL-TIME HOLDERS OF PUBLIC OFFICE

- 1.1 In this part, Determination No 5 of 1999 (as amended) is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 1.2 Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination is amended by increasing the basic rate of salary for the Director, Professional Services Review from \$119,600 to \$125,500 with effect on and from 8 September 2000.
- 1.3 Re-number current footnotes 19 to 21 contained within Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination to 20 to 22.
- 1.4 Insert new footnote 19 in Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination for the Director, Professional Services Review:
"Base salary of \$125,500 with effect on and from 8 September 2000."
- 1.5 In accordance with Part 4 of the Principal Determination, The Managing Director of the Defence Housing Authority, Mr Keith Lyon, shall be paid a pro- rata performance remuneration of \$12,500 for the period 1 September 1999 to 30 June 2000.
- 1.6 Professor Stephen Hall, Director of the Australian Institute of Marine Science shall receive rental assistance allowance of up to \$21,500 a year for the period of his appointment during which he maintains rental accommodation in Townsville.

PART 2

PART-TIME HOLDERS OF PUBLIC OFFICE

- 2.1 In this Part, Determination No 3 of 1999 (as amended) is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 2.2 Insert new footnote # reference into Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination for the Defence Housing Authority effective on and from 19 September 2000.

- 2.3 Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination is amended by inserting the following:

- 2.5 Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination is amended by inserting the following:

- "With effect on and from 1 September 2000."
- 2.7 Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination is amended by inserting the following:

- 2.8 Insert new footnote 4 in Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination for the National Institute of Clinical Studies (NICS):
- "Chair is entitled to Tier 1 travel arrangements and Members are entitled to Tier 2 travel arrangements."
- 2.9 Re-number all the numbered footnotes in Part 1, Table 1 of the Principal Determination in sequential order following the changes made in clauses 2.4, 2.6 and 2.8 of this Determination
- 2.10 Remove all references from the Principal Determination to the office of Medical Member of the Veterans' Review Board.
- 2.11 Insert new footnote 6 in Part 2, Table 2 of the Principal Determination for the Chairman of the Quarantine Exports Advisory Council:
- "This fee will continue whilst Professor Nairn holds this position."
- 2.12 Replace footnote number 9 in Part 2, Table 2 of the Principal Determination with the following:
- "Members of the Migration Review Tribunal receive a per diem fee for seven hours work (which may be cumulative over several days)."
- 2.13 Delete Footnote number 11 in Part 2, Table 2 of the Principal Determination referring to the New Tax System Advisory Board.
- 2.14 Re-number all the numbered footnotes in Part 2, Table 2 of the Principal Determination in sequential order following the changes made in clauses 2.11, 2.12 and 2.13 of this Determination.

PART 3**JUDICIAL AND RELATED OFFICES**

- 3.1 In this Part, Determination 2000/13 is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 3.2 In accordance with the provisions contained in Table 1 of the Principal Determination, the Chief Executive Officer of the Family Court of Australia, Mr Richard Foster, shall be paid pro-rata performance remuneration of \$3,600 for the period 1 May 2000 to 30 June 2000.
- 3.3 In accordance with the provisions contained in Table 1 of the Principal Determination, the Chief Executive Officer of the Federal Magistrates Service, Mr Peter May shall be paid pro-rata performance remuneration of \$3,590 for the period 23 March 2000 to 30 June 2000.

PART 4**SPECIFIED STATUTORY OFFICES**

- 4.1 In this Part, Determination 1999/04, (as amended), is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 4.2 Delete the words "or Specified Statutory Officer" from clauses 4.1, 4.4 and 4.6 of the Principal Determination.
- 4.3 Insert a new clause 4.7 after clause 4.6 of the Principal Determination:
"4.7 From 29 November 2000, Specified Statutory Officers, being the holders of offices as specified in the first column of Part B of Schedule A, shall be eligible for travel entitlements on the conditions determined from time to time for full-time public office holders entitled to Tier 1 travel arrangements under Determination 1999/05."
- 4.4 Delete the office of Public Service Commissioner from Part B of Schedule A of the Principal Determination.

PART 5**RATES OF TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE**

- 5.1 In this Part, Determination 6 of 2000 is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 5.2 With effect on and from 23 November 2000, Part 3 of the Principal Determination is amended by deleting the rates of motor vehicle allowance contained in Column 4 and replacing them with: Item 1 - 59.5 cents; Item 2 - 58.5 cents; and Item 3 - 48.9 cents.
- 5.3 Part 2 of the Principal Determination (Rates of Travelling Allowance) is amended with effect on and from 1 January 2001 by deleting the table under the heading "TIER 1 – RATES OF TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE – per overnight stay" and inserting:

PART 6

MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT – TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE

- 6.1 In this Part, Determination 8 of 1998 is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 6.2 The Principal Determination is amended by deleting the first paragraph of the Principal Determination and replacing it with the following:
 “Pursuant to subsections 7(1) and 7(2) of the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*, the Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into travelling allowances payable within Australia and conditions of payment to members of the Parliament and Ministers of State, and determines as set out hereunder, with effect on and from 14 April 1998, unless otherwise specified.”
- 6.3 Part 1 of the Principal Determination is amended by deleting the Table of travelling allowance rates and replacing it with the Table at Attachment A to this Determination, with effect on and from 1 January 2001.
- 6.4 Clause 5 of Part 2 of the Principal Determination is deleted and replaced, with effect on and from 1 January 2001 by:
 “The Prime Minister shall be provided with accommodation and sustenance up to a limit of \$455 for each overnight stay in a place other than an official establishment or the Prime Minister’s home base. If no receipt is produced or certification made that a receipt can be produced on request, the Prime Minister is entitled to one-third of \$455 (rounded upwards to the nearest whole dollar). Accommodation and sustenance at official establishments shall be provided at government expense.”
