



## REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

### Determination 2001/20: Members of Parliament - Allowances

- (i) Pursuant to subsections 7(1) and 7(4) of the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*, the Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into the allowances to be paid to members of the Parliament and matters significantly related thereto, and determines as set out below.
- (ii) This Determination takes effect on and from the date of signature except where specified otherwise.

#### PART 1

#### MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT – ALLOWANCES

- 1.1 In this part, Determination Number 26 of 1998 (as amended) is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 1.2 Sub-clause 4.1 of the Principal Determination is amended by deleting the words 'a spouse, nominee or dependent child' in paragraph (c), and inserting the following in their place: 'a spouse, nominee, dependent child or designated person'.
- 1.3 Clause 10 of the Principal Determination is amended by deleting the following words from sub-clause 10.6: 'shall be returned to the Commonwealth or'.
- 1.4 Clause 10 of the Principal Determination is amended by inserting after sub-clause 10.8 the following new sub-clause 10.8A:  
  
'From the date of formal determination of the new electoral divisions by the Australian Electoral Commission, a Member may use his or her communications allowance entitlement to communicate with residents of an adjoining or nearby area, if that area and part of the Member's existing electoral division are to become part of the same electoral division.'
