



REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

Determination 2002/05:

Remuneration and allowances of the Solicitor-General and the Director of Public Prosecutions

- (i) The Remuneration Tribunal is empowered to inquire into and determine the remuneration and significantly related matters for holders of public office as defined in the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*.
- (ii) This Determination, No 5 of 2002 takes effect on and from 1 October 2001.


PART 1 REMUNERATION AND ALLOWANCES

- 1.1 In this part, Determination No 15 of 2000 (as amended) is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 1.2 Table 1 of the Principal Determination is deleted and replaced with the following with effect on and from 1 October 2001:
