



## REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

### Explanatory Memorandum: Determination 2003/22

1. The Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into and determined the remuneration and significantly related matters for public office holders, as it is empowered to do by the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*.
2. The retrospective application of this determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such a person.

#### **PART 1 – PART-TIME OFFICE HOLDERS**

3. Clause 1.1 specifies the Principal Determination (Number 3 of 2003) for the purposes of Part 1 of the Determination.
4. Clause 1.2 specifies the deletion of the Board of Civil Aviation Safety Authority, Chair, Deputy Chair and Member due to the abolition of these offices.
5. Clause 1.3 specifies the translation of remuneration for the Chairman of the Medical Services Advisory Committee from a per diem fee to an annualised fee. This is with effect on and from 14 October 2003.
6. Clause 1.4 specifies an increase in remuneration for the Member, Australian Sports Commission and the establishment of an Audit Committee fee for the Chair and Members, Australian Sports Commission due to increased work value and audit committee responsibilities. This is with effect on and from 14 October 2003.
7. Clause 1.5 specifies the deletion of the Professional Services Review Tribunal from the list of Professional Committees – Health and Aged Care and Family and Community Services Portfolio as a per diem fee is set.

#### **PART 2 – FULL-TIME OFFICE HOLDERS**

8. Clause 1.6 specifies the Principal Determination (Number 11 of 2003) for the purposes of Part 2 of the Determination.
9. Clause 1.7 specifies an increase in remuneration for the Member, SSAT due to work value increases with effect on and from 14 October 2003.
10. Clause 1.8 reformats the current provisions for accommodation allowance and specifies new entitlements for Mr R Jones, Deputy Chair of Australian Prudential Regulatory Authority until 30 June 2005 and for Mr S Somogyi, a Member of APRA.
11. Clause 1.9 reformats the current provision for reunion travel and specifies a new entitlement for Mr S Somogyi to receive an allowance for reunion travel.
