



REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

Explanatory Memorandum: Determination 2002/19

1. The Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into and determined the remuneration and significantly related matters for public office holders, as it is empowered to do by the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*.
2. The retrospective application of this determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such a person.

PART 1 FULL - TIME HOLDERS OF PUBLIC OFFICE

3. Clause 1.1 specifies the Principal Determination (Number 6 of 2001) for the purposes of Part 1 of the Determination.
4. Clause 1.2 specifies that the First Parliamentary Counsel will receive a performance bonus.

PART 2 PART - TIME HOLDERS OF PUBLIC OFFICE

5. Clause 1.3 specifies the Principal Determination (Number 10 of 2002) for the purposes of Part 2 of the Determination.
6. Clause 1.4 deletes reference to an office specified in the Principal Determination. The office of Commonwealth Child Care Advisory Council has been deleted as it ceased operation on 30 September 2002.
7. Clause 1.5 establishes rates for the Chairs of three National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) Expert Committees established under s.39 of the NHMRC Act.
8. Clause 1.6 inserts a footnote in relation to the three above mentioned Expert Committees that stipulates the date of effect of the new remuneration.
9. Clause 1.7 specifies a general increase in remuneration for the Director, Social Security Appeals Tribunal with effect from 19 November 2002.
10. Clause 1.8 inserts a footnote in relation to the Director, Social Security Appeals Tribunal that stipulates the date of effect of the new remuneration.
