



## REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

### **Determination 2003/16: Remuneration and Allowances for various Holders of Public Office**

- (i) Pursuant to subsections 7(3) and 7(4) of the *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973*, the Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into the remuneration and allowances to be paid to various public office holders, and other matters significantly related thereto, and determines as set out below.
- (ii) This Determination takes effect on and from the date of signature except where specified otherwise.

#### **PART 1**

#### **PUBLIC OFFICE HOLDERS**

- 1.1 In this part, Determination Number 11 of 1992 (as amended) is referred to as the Principal Determination.
- 1.2 The Principal Determination is amended by deleting clause 1 and inserting the following in its place:
  - " A person who holds public office is not entitled to compensation for loss of office under clause 3 where:
    - (a) the person served the full term of appointment;
    - (b) the person was appointed on a part-time basis and eligible for either a daily or annualised fee (rather than a base salary or other component of Total Remuneration, or a proportion thereof);
    - (c) the appointment was terminated prematurely for reasons of unsatisfactory performance; or
    - (d) the appointment was terminated prematurely on account of mental or physical incapacity and the person is entitled to receive invalidity retirement benefits under Commonwealth superannuation legislation".
