Report Number 1 of 2025 Report on Ministerial Salaries Salary Additional to the Parliamentary Base Salary

Pursuant to sub-section 44(1) of the *Parliamentary Business Resources Act 2017*, the Remuneration Tribunal has inquired into the question of whether any alterations are desirable in the Ministerial salaries that are payable out of public money of the Commonwealth. The Remuneration Tribunal reports it does not consider any alterations are desirable in the Ministerial salaries that are payable out of public money of the Commonwealth, and that the rates of additional salaries payable to Ministers of State, per annum, be maintained as set out below.

| Parliamentary Secretaries | 25.0 |

The Deputy Prime Minister when acting Prime Minister should be paid the same rate per annum of salary payable to the Prime Minister.
